INTERNATIONAL LUTHERAN LAYMEN'S LEAGUE CONVENTION

The 90th Convention of the Lutheran Laymen's League will be held in Duluth, Minnesota July 26 – July 29. The theme of this year's convention is "Let Your Light Shine." Speakers at this year's convention include The Reverend Doctor Ken Klaus, speaker of the Lutheran Hour, and Jeffrey Williams a United States Astronaut with NASA. The Rev. Mark Muechow, the pastoral advisor for the International LLL, will lead the Bible studies and worship during the convention.

Business activities at this convention are limited to the election of officers and members of the Board of Directors. There maybe a limited number of resolutions that will be acted upon. Educational Workshops for all attendees will be held on Friday and Saturday. Subject areas of the workshops include Leadership Development, Global Outreach, and Community Outreach. Each attendee will be able to select 6 workshops of a total of 22. The convention is a great opportunity to spend time with fellow Christians in fellowship Praising and Glorifying our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

DISASTER RESPONSE

The North Dakota District Lutheran Laymen's League Disaster Response Team traveled to Clewiston, Florida to provide assistance to people suffering hurricane damage caused by Hurricane Wilma in 2005.

A group of 10 people left Fargo on the 15th and returned on the 24th of February. The group was able to complete new roofing on 2 homes and started a third. The work projects were arranged through Lutheran Disaster Relief and the Clewiston Community Rebuilding Ecumenical Workforce.

The group was provided housing in a Presbyterian Church in Clewiston. They also had the use of the kitchen in the church and were able to prepare many of their own meals. Again work was done through Lutheran Disaster Relief.

As in past years, this trip provided a golden opportunity to witness the love of Christ to others.

MISSION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The North Dakota Lutheran Laymen's League has set up a Mission Scholarship Program to help promote interest in their mission program, which may include mission trips to Mexico, Disaster Relief trips to aid people in time of disasters, and Global Work and Witness Trips. The

Scholarship will be available to any Lutheran Laymen's League member (in North Dakota all members, men and women, of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod are considered members of the Lutheran Laymen's League) between the age of 18 and 35.
